

# Month on the Farm

With no calves on milk for a couple of months, it gives the hutches and buildings a rest, allowing for a good clean and the fresh air to kill any bugs off. Although the mornings are easier, there is still a lot of stock to check out in the fields, with the occasional moving of groups to fresh clean pastures, sometimes an easy move, just pick up the electric fencing and sometimes back to the yard to drench the cattle to clear out any worms and other times to apply a fly repellent to keep the pesky flies off as they are



prone to cause eye infections which can cause blindness if it is not seen and treated promptly.

We have made a small amount of hay, but have some more grass to cut off some fields that are in an environmental scheme and have to be left to allow the birds to nest and the flowers to shed seed, these are not allowed to be cut until the middle of July, then depending on the weather it will be made into hay or silage.





All the ewes have been weaned away from the lambs and are grazing some downland which is older grass and will allow the ewes to tick over during the summer and rebuild some of their body condition that they have lost whilst feeding their youngsters. The older ewes which have not got many teeth or bad udders have been sold as culls through market. The ewes and the lambs have also had a fly spray and are undergoing some foot treatment at regular intervals to try and cure a foot disease that was unfortunately brought into the flock by some carrier ewes.

The maize has suddenly grown upwards but has been hindered by the colder days and nights, the rain showers have though certainly helped the later drilled crops to develop. The combines have been serviced, the trailers all washed, whilst we wait for the corn to ripen which is fast approaching, with the winter barley turning yellow and the grains hardening. One piece of oil seed rape will be ready in about a week, the other a while away still.

• Over the past few weeks we have

had visits to the farm here from schools, Girl Guides, meetings for farmers and other groups some with tractor and trailer rides, talks with speakers on relevant subjects in the grain store, river dipping on the River Piddle and a favourite with children of running through the lines of the growing maize.







Honeysuckle Class had a wonderful trip to one of our partners in learning, Wessex Wild Farm in Tincleton. As part of our enquiry question linked to the Anglo-Saxons, we learnt about farming now and how it compares to how the Anglo-Saxons farmed.



This term in Bluebell class we have been exploring the inquiry question 'Why do we like to live beside the sea?'. 
