Every hour counts



What is it that can't be bought, can't be swapped and when it's gone, it's gone? It's time.

Many of us feel we don't have enough of it – our lives are so busy that there is never enough time to do all that we want to do. Others feel that time moves too slowly – that there is too much of it to fill.

I've been reflecting on time since the sudden death of my father at the end of April. I ask myself whether he would have done anything differently that day had he known it would be his last. And, of course, I'll never know the answer to that question. But we do know that all of us will one day reach the end of our lives here on earth. I wonder whether that makes any difference to the way we use our time.

It's not something I imagine most of us spend many minutes thinking about until, perhaps, we are faced with our own mortality either because someone we love dies or our life changes dramatically through illness or injury or frailty or something else that knocks us off course.

I've been asking myself whether I am happy with the way I spend my time, the balance of priorities and the things I fill my days with. And I have a mixed response to that. I get it right sometimes but not at other times. So what would help me to make better choices?

First, I think being more aware of my own mortality. Facing the truth that at some point my life will come to an end, that my days are limited, so I should use them in the best possible way.

Second, remembering that rest is as important as busy-ness – taking time to be rather than to do is vital if we are to flourish. Sabbath rest has been an important part of Christianity and its Jewish roots before then, first introduced in the Bible as a concept in the story of creation as told in Genesis and found in the Ten Commandments.

Third, seeing each day as a gift to be treasured. Even bad days can be turned around when each day is seen as precious. Sunshine gladdens our hearts but let's remember that rain is also a gift without which we would not have life.

The Psalmist asks God to "teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Psalm 90.12). The wise person knows that every hour counts.





Month on the Farm



Over the past few weeks we have spread all of the farmyard manure (straw and cattle muck mixed together which is left to rot down) onto the fields that are growing the maize in them. Some of the fields have had the cover crops growing on them which were grazed by the cattle or just incorporated into the ground. The manure is loaded into the spreader with the loader before being spread evenly across the ground by the muck spreaders.

This year is two of the fields we then ploughed the fields, turning the soil over and burying the muck and at the same time pulling along the press to help firm the surface and so break down the lumps. The other field will have a couple of passes with the heavy cultivator which lift the ground and mixes the muck and the soil together as it is pulled through the field. We then pull a set of discs and packer rollers across the soil to prepare the seed bed in front of the drill. The maize likes a nice deep seed bed so that when



it germinates it's roots can push downwards to find the moisture in the warm dry days of summer! The drill then follows placing the seeds individually into the ground about 2 inches deep, we then roll the fields to firm the soil helping to get a good seed to soil contact and keeping in the moisture.



We still have a lot of the younger cattle indoors as the grass has not been growing fast enough to keep ahead of them all if they were all grazing outside. At the end of the last week we managed to cut and round bale some grass and made a few bales of high quality silage ready for feeding when they have gone through the conversion process from grass to silage in the autumn.

The oil seed rape has all finished flowering with it's bright yellow flowers, and the pods are filling up. Next week we are having our 6 monthly TB Test of all the cattle, so lets hope for some cooperative cattle and some good weather to help the big job go easily.

PUDDLETOWN NEIGHBOUR CAR SCHEME

Many people reading this will, I'm sure, have heard of the Puddletown Neighbour Car Scheme. Some of you may even have made use of its services. It was set up to provide affordable transport to medical appointments for those unable to get to appointments by any other means.

I have been driving for the scheme for about 7 years and find it rewarding and enjoyable. Aside from the fact that doing something to help out other people always gives one a little glow of self satisfaction, I've met some really interesting people with amazing life stories to tell.

Briefly, the way the scheme operates is that a client who needs transport phones one of the scheme coordinators who operate on a rota system. The coordinator then phones around the volunteers until they find one who is available. As a volunteer, when a coordinator phones me I'm free to accept or turn down the request. There is never any pressure to accept the request but in practice I always accept if I have no prior commitments. I've never found the time commitment to be onerous. I think there have only been one or two occasions in seven years when I've taken on more than one client in a week; it usually works out at about once every two weeks. Most appointments are to the surgery in Puddletown, Dorchester Hospital or dentists in Dorchester.

From the comments I've received from clients, I know how much the scheme is appreciated and valued and I sincerely hope that it will still be running if I ever need its services! However we are currently struggling with a shortage of drivers, particularly now that holiday season is approaching. If you have a car and a bit of spare time I would really urge you to consider joining the team. Please do contact me if you would like a bit more information or I can put you in touch with one of the coordinators.
