Month on the Farm

The dull, damp and changing temperatures of the last few weeks have caused some issues with pneumonia in the weaned calves which we have tried to control with regular cleaning out of the damp bedding and using copious amounts of fresh, clean and dry straw, sometimes bedding up twice a day with regular checking of the calves health and under extreme circumstances an antibiotic

extreme circumstances an antibiotic injection is administered. The stocks of hav,

silage and straw are reducing as the winter goes by and some of the weaned calves are really tucking into the forage along with their barley mixture.

Work on the arable fields is pretty limited except for a small amount of spraying which needed the colder temperatures for the chemicals to work effectively. Some of the hedges have been trimmed with more to do when ground conditions allow.

At the moment we have only a few calves on milk as it has been difficult to find them as there is a quiet time of the cows calving between the autumn calving dairy herds finishing and the spring calving ones not started yet coupled with the restrictions put in place of livestock movements due to the Bluetongue midge, which at the time of writing is not in this area, but we were instructed by DEFRA's Animal Health Department to blood test a hundred animals to see if they were infected by the disease in early January, thankfully the results were clear.

Earlier this week we were woken in the middle of the night by some unfamiliar noises which turned out to be some thieves who had broken into our grain store by wrecking the small metal security door enabling them to open the larger door and then pushed the quad bike out of the yard and up the road also taking with them some tools. It was a strange feeling to go into the yard when everything is quiet, cold and very icy and find the doors open and then a few minutes later hear the bike, which had been hot wired as we still have the keys, race up the road where it was loaded up. Although the police were soon on the scene they were unable to catch the culprits or find the stolen items. Since the break in we have had to make a new door to replace the one damaged beyond repair and increase the security measures and suffer the inconvenience of not having a bike for daily livestock duties and the tools when you need them!!



Why exercise is not only about fitness:

We all lose muscle with age, typically about 3%-5% each decade after age 30. Inactive people lose the most. The loss can become more noticeable and may start to speed up at around age 60. But why does this matter?...

Losing muscle and therefore strength, means you may struggle to do simple everyday things such as getting out of a chair, opening a jar, or carrying groceries.

This could lead to more frailty and a higher risk of falls, broken bones, disability.



Beware of illegal money lenders

Have they threatened you?

Are you scared of people finding out?

Have they taken your bank card, benefit card, passport, watch or other valuables from you?

Illegal lenders may appear to be a friend offering a favour, but they often target people in vulnerable circumstances and the fact that they are unauthorised means borrowers are left with no protection when it comes to repaying the loan.

In November a joint Trading Standards and England Illegal Money Lending Team investigation led to the prosecution of a 47 year old woman who was money lending in the Exeter area. She had been lending money illegally through 110 loans while working as a professional carer.

Update






There really was something for everyone.
