<u>Making Jesus Known</u>

This year the month of May is full of feasts and festivals – special days when the church remembers certain aspects of its life.

On 9th May, we remember the day Jesus ascended into heaven, forty days after the resurrection. He gave his disciples a commandment to go and make disciples of all nations. Which they did, especially after the release of the Holy Spirit upon them ten days later. The Early Church spread rapidly in the face of severe opposition; the message of those early disciples caught the imagination and many people converted to Christianity.

We celebrate the coming of that Spirit at Pentecost, which gave power and confidence to those early disciples to fulfil that command to go into the world with the message of Jesus. Often known as the birthday of the church, it was Pentecost that changed Jesus's followers from a quiet and cowed bunch following his death and resurrection into a spirited and eloquent group.

They certainly went and made Jesus known. Our new diocesan vision is Making Jesus Known – across five different areas of church life: local partnerships, justice, climate action, financial security and Christian leadership. It's not just that first group of disciples who are called to tell the story of the good news of Jesus Christ, but all Christian people, through our words, deed and the way we live our lives. We are often reticent about this, but God's Spirit will give us the confidence we need, just as the first disciples received it.

Later in the month on 26th, we celebrate Trinity Sunday, a day when we remember who God is – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – rather than what God does.

Earlier in the month, 5th May, is Rogation Sunday. In times past, this was the day when the beating of the bounds would take place. Parishioners would walk around the boundaries of their parish, asking God to bless the crops for the coming year. In the days before maps were ubiquitous, it gave people a sense of where they came from and the parameters of their community.

Other people remembered this month include the disciple Philip, Matthias the apostle who replaced Judas, Julian of Norwich, the venerable Bede, the hymn writers John and Charles Wesley and local Aldhelm, the first Bishop of Sherborne.



Animal allergens in vegan and plant-based food

The Food Standards Agency is running a campaign to advise people with milk, egg, fish or shellfish allergies, or those who care for people with these types of allergies, to always check the label on vegan and plant-based food as it may not be safe to eat.

Foods marked as vegan or plant-based are not guaranteed to be free from products of animal origin, and therefore could still contain allergenic ingredients. This is because a vegan label is not a food safety label so risks remain of crosscontamination in manufacturing and production processes that might mean vegan or plant-based food is not safe for some people to eat.

Q: Do you know the difference between a 'free-from' and 'vegan' label?

A: A 'free-from' label guarantees the product doesn't contain the named allergen. To use this label, food businesses must follow strict processes to ensure the allergen isn't present.

However, these rules don't apply to vegan or plant-based products, which means there could be a chance of cross-contamination with allergens such as milk, eggs, fish or shellfish.

Q: Do you have an allergy to milk, eggs, fish, or shellfish? Do you eat vegan food to help manage your allergies?

A: Vegan food isn't always safe for people with these allergies because of potential cross-contamination during manufacturing and preparation processes.

For peace of mind that ingredients such as milk, eggs, fish, or shellfish aren't present in vegan food or plant-based food through cross-contamination, always check for precautionary allergen labels such as a 'may contain' statement. This will help prevent an allergic reaction.

The Food Standards Agency advises - Never assume vegan or plant-based food is safe for people with certain allergies. Don't take the risk. Always read the label.

Month on the Farm



At last some dry warm days and now the grass is really growing away well. The cattle had finished grazing the turnips before the dry weather came and so they were just fed on straw for a while, but are now enjoying some good nutritious spring grass on the permanent pastures. Some of the autumn born calves that were reared on milk and have been in the

sheds all winter have been turned out onto the herbal leys here at home, and are growing along well without needing a supplementary barley mix as the mixed variety of grasses, clover and herbs are more than adequate for their dietary needs. We still have a lot of calves on milk from the spring calving dairy herds, but we shall have them all on this farm within the next couple of weeks and then in a couple of months everything will be weaned.

The winter drilled corn is romping through the growth stages and with the inclement weather we have had some of the spray plans not working out. They have had to be adjusted with some of the crops missing a fungicide spray applied to protect the plants from disease so leaving the crop vulnerable. It is always a challenge to know what diseases to protect against as some are more wet weather active and some are more suited to dryer conditions, a lot of the newer grain varieties



are bred to be resistant to them so careful choice and a decent weather pattern can help to alleviate some of the risk.



The ewes and lambs are all outside enjoying the grass and the ewes have stopped having concentrate as the lambs are getting bigger and now eating grass. They are also being fed a creep feed of barley and nuts. Vet students stay with us in the farm house to help our eldest son's larger flock of sheep lambing here and outside on the hills above Cheselbourne, as part of their course is gaining practical experience.


- Cakes of all shapes, sizes and flavours*

Join Us in Making Our Community Safer: As members of a vibrant and caring community, we all share the responsibility of ensuring the safety of our streets and neighbourhoods. That's why we're reaching out to you today with an important invitation: we need your help to make our roads safer through the Community Speed Watch and SID (Speed Indicator Device) program. Speeding vehicles pose a significant risk to pedestrians, cyclists, and other motorists. By volunteering for the Community Speed Watch and SID program, you can play a direct role in promoting safer driving habits and reducing speeding in our area.

What is Community Speed Watch? Community Speed Watch is run by Dorset Police, with the aid of local volunteers. All volunteers are trained to use speed detection equipment to monitor the speed of vehicles in designated areas. Data collected by volunteers is then shared with the authorities to help identify speeding hotspots and inform targeted enforcement efforts. Enforcement letters are sent to anyone who is caught County wide speeding, so this program does have an impact. On average sessions are held once a month during the warmer months, but you are not expected to join every month only when you are able to.

What is the SID Program? Every six weeks the Speed Indicator Device (SID) needs to be moved from one location to another within our community. These signs visually display the speed of approaching vehicles, serving as a reminder to drivers to adhere to the posted speed limits.






